




It's 1999.

In this brutal 75 minute play, the girls piece together the insidious motivators driving their mother's life and possible death, while also unraveling of death, afterlife, beforelife, entropy, god, meaning, nihilism and finally, a great epiphany.

Sara's CasablancaBox opened Off-Broadway to a sold-out run, was nominated for two 2017 Drama Desk Awards and was originally commissioned as part of HARP @ HERE Arts Center. Sara's work has been called "dazzling" by The New Yorker and "brave, almost foolhardy" by The New York Times. Her plays have toured internationally, most recently A Trojan Woman, her version of the Euripides, which toured to Athens, Belfast, London, Luna Stage in NJ and then premiered at Powerhouse Theater @ Vassar in July with Stop The Wind Theatricals. Look Out will be further developed at Deep Space Residency @ NaCL, Fall 2026. Other favorite plays include Dora Maar (Mercury Store Spring '23), BrandoCapote (The Tank NYC), Mendacity (film of the play, 2023 selection @ NYCITFF Film Festival), The Return (commission from The Metropolitan Museum of Art) Near Vicksburg (Incubator Arts Project) and The Rise & Fall of Miles & Milo (FringeNYC Award for Outstanding Playwriting). Melissa Firlit, DIRECTOR

Melissa Firlit is a director and educator based in New York City with national and international credits. Her work has been seen at 59E59 Theaters, Luna Stage, Mile Square Theatre, Creede Repertory Theatre, and the Denver Center for the Performing Arts. Internationally, she has directed multiple productions at the Edinburgh Fringe Festival and toured Ireland with Misterman. Her directing credits span contemporary plays, musicals, and new works, including Lonely Planet, Jekyll & Hyde, Red, A Few Good Men, Dracula, Men on Boats, Trojan Women, Goodbody, and Pirates of Penzance. Dedicated to supporting emerging voices, she has developed and premiered new plays through platforms such as id(iots) at play, VoxFest (Dartmouth), Dragon's Egg, and the Thingamajig Playwrights Festival. Her work has been recognized with nominations for the Henry Award for Outstanding Director of a Musical, as well as honors from the New York Innovative Theatre Awards and commendations at the Edinburgh Fringe Festival, reflecting her range across theatrical styles. Melissa is the Artistic Director of Resolve Productions, a New York-based company committed to developing new work and creating meaningful community impact. She holds an MFA in Directing from Rutgers University and currently serves on the theatre faculty at both Fort Lewis College and CAP21/Molloy University, where she mentors and trains the next generation of theatre artists.





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
